## PACKING OBJECTS FOR FREEZING

Always wear gloves when handling objects, lift heavy objects from their base and never lift heavy objects alone.







 <p>Tissue &amp; Tyvek</p>	
<p>Pack object with tissue interleaving and support in a box that properly fits the object</p>	<p>Fully cover object with tissue and Tyvek. If multiple objects in a box only same materials and heaviest on bottom (e.g. no metal with textiles)</p>
	
<p>Multiple boxes: largest and heaviest on bottom</p>	<p>Fold and roll to seal edges</p>
	
<p>Use plenty of packing tape over all seams to seal, label with permanent marker on several sides</p>	<p>Always strap objects to a pallet for transport and leave on pallet for freezing</p>



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## PACKING LARGE OBJECTS FOR FREEZING

	
<p>Before packing, support any broken parts that might get damaged further during transport (e.g. broken legs).</p>	<p>Protect the surface with tissue paper or with a similar soft, clean, absorbent material. Avoid using tape to secure the packing material!</p>
	
<p>Fill out any free spaces with tissue paper to get as much air out of the package as possible. It acts as a buffer against changes in humidity.</p>	<p>Fold and seal the edges of the plastic. The packaging should be as air tight as possible. Do not attach the tape to the object!</p>
	
<p>Label with permanent marker the name of the museum, object number and packing date.</p>	<p>Always strap objects to a pallet for transport and leave on pallet for freezing.</p>
